# **Year Group Information**

### Year 7

Our year 7 students have been busy signing up for the Exe Valley Challenge which takes place on Sunday July 13 – this is a 10 miles walking challenge along the river Exe in teams of 4. # Year 8

Our year 8 students have been signing up for the Jurassic Coast Challenge which takes place on Friday June 13. This is a walking challenge which begins in Lyme Regis and involves walking the coastal path back to Branscombe (Bronze), Sidmouth (Silver) or Exmouth (Gold). Last year we were oversubscribed and it has proved to be very popular again this year - even the 0500 early start hasn't put students off!

# Year 9

Year 9 students have now chosen their humanities options for next year.

Year 9s have applied and will soon find out if they have been successful to be primary mentors for our upcoming year 6 cohort.

Our Year 9 students have been busy preparing for their Duke of Edinburgh Award expeditions, with practice walks scheduled for 21-22 June and their qualifying expedition on 28-29 June. They have tested their outdoor cooking skills using trangias, rating the results of their meal choices. For many, this is the final step in their Bronze Award journey, having already completed the Skills, Physical, and Volunteering sections over the past 3-6 months. We've seen impressive baking projects and meaningful volunteering efforts both in school and in the wider community.
