Exciting Enrichment Week opportunities for Years 7–9 are now live via your MCAS account for the week of 14–18 July 2025. Packed with unforgettable activities and experiences - have you booked yours yet?

This week and next, our science classrooms will be buzzing with activity across all year groups. Year 7 students will delve into the fascinating world of photosynthesis, using practical experiments to investigate how light intensity affects the rate of photosynthesis. Year 8 will get hands-on with electricity, exploring current, potential difference, and resistance in both series and parallel circuits through interactive scientific investigations. Our Year 9 students will continue to focus on motion, examining how the mass of a trolley affects its acceleration. Year 10 students will deepen their understanding of work done and power by calculating energy transfers and rates of energy use, applying these concepts to real-world contexts like mechanical systems, and energy efficiency in everyday technologies. Meanwhile, Year 11 students are hard at work on focused revision for their upcoming Biology, Chemistry, and Physics Paper 2 exams, ensuring they're well-prepared for success.

Wednesday, 25 June is Day of Sports for Y7-10 during the day students will have the opportunity to compete in different sports and activities, learn and apply rules and game etiquette.
