Celebrations

Last weekend, WES proudly entered three teams into the prestigious Ten Tors event—two 35-mile teams and one 45-mile team. After months of committed training, our students arrived at the start line on Saturday morning filled with a mix of nerves and excitement. The event began in style with an impressive aerial display from the parachute team, setting the tone for an unforgettable weekend.

Both our 35 and 45-mile teams set off strongly, but a technology glitch on day one left us unsure of their precise locations. Thankfully, the Army team was incredibly supportive, providing our Team Managers with regular updates so we could track the students' progress and share it with their supporters.

By the end of day one, one of our 35 teams had set up camp at Postbridge, while the other reached Stannon Tor. Our determined 45 team pushed beyond White Barrow, finally setting up camp after 10pm.

Day two saw all three teams make remarkable progress—clearly, a good night's sleep worked wonders! With early starts and impressive pace, our teams achieved some of WES's fastest finishing times ever: the 45-mile team completed the course by 1:50pm, and both 35-mile teams followed closely behind, finishing between 3:00 and 3:30pm. Throughout the weekend, the support from staff and families was incredible—with some even stepping in to help with cooking. It truly was a team effort in every sense. We are immensely proud of our students and all they've achieved—not only during the event but throughout their training. Their resilience, teamwork, and determination will undoubtedly shape their futures in powerful ways.

Last week, 130 students from Years 7 and 8 took part in the national Junior Maths Challenge, showcasing impressive problem-solving skills and mathematical thinking. An incredible 70 students earned certificates, with awards spanning Gold, Silver, and Bronze. Special congratulations go to Emilio M, Freddy R, Alex G, Jedidiah M, Charlie R, Marcel K, and Daniel S, who have been invited to compete in the next round of the competition. A particular highlight: Emilio M Year 7 student to earn a Gold certificate, and Freddy R achieved the highest score among all participants from both year groups. Well done to everyone involved!

On Thursday, 15 May, 11 of our talented Year 10 musicians took to the stage at Devon County Show to showcase some of the fantastic work that they have done with various performances from this half term. All performances were warmly received by the large audience and they truly demonstrated their talents!

This week in science, students across all year groups have been engaged in a range of exciting and challenging topics. Year 7 students have been exploring chemical reactions through practical investigations, including testing for different gases and observing the thermal decomposition of copper carbonate using a Bunsen burner. Year 8 have been learning about static electricity and had great fun using the Van de Graaff generator to explore how static electricity behaves. Year 9 have been developing their understanding of motion by interpreting distance-time graphs and calculating speed. Year 10 have delved into the dangers of radiation, with discussions linked to real-world events such as the Chernobyl disaster. Meanwhile, Year 11 have completed their first Biology paper and are now focused on revising for their remaining science exams.
